The Treaty of Waitangi

Article the First

Article the First

That the United Confederation of the United States of New Zealand
and its several and individual Chiefs respectively the Queen of the said Society
shall be supported to exercise in to possess over their respective
territories as the sole sovereigns thereof

Article the Second

Article the 30th
Her Majesty the Queen of England confirms and guarantees to the Chiefs and
to the respective families and individuals who possess the Lands and Estates Forests Fisheries
and other Rights and Privileges which they may collectively or individually possess so long as
they shall desire to retain the same in the full and free Possession of the Chiefs of
the said Tribes and the individual Chiefs yield to the Crown the exclusive right
of disposing of the said Lands as the Proprietors thereof may be disposed to alienate
the same as may be agreed upon between the respective Proprietors and
the Crown and the Her Majesty to treat with them in that behalf

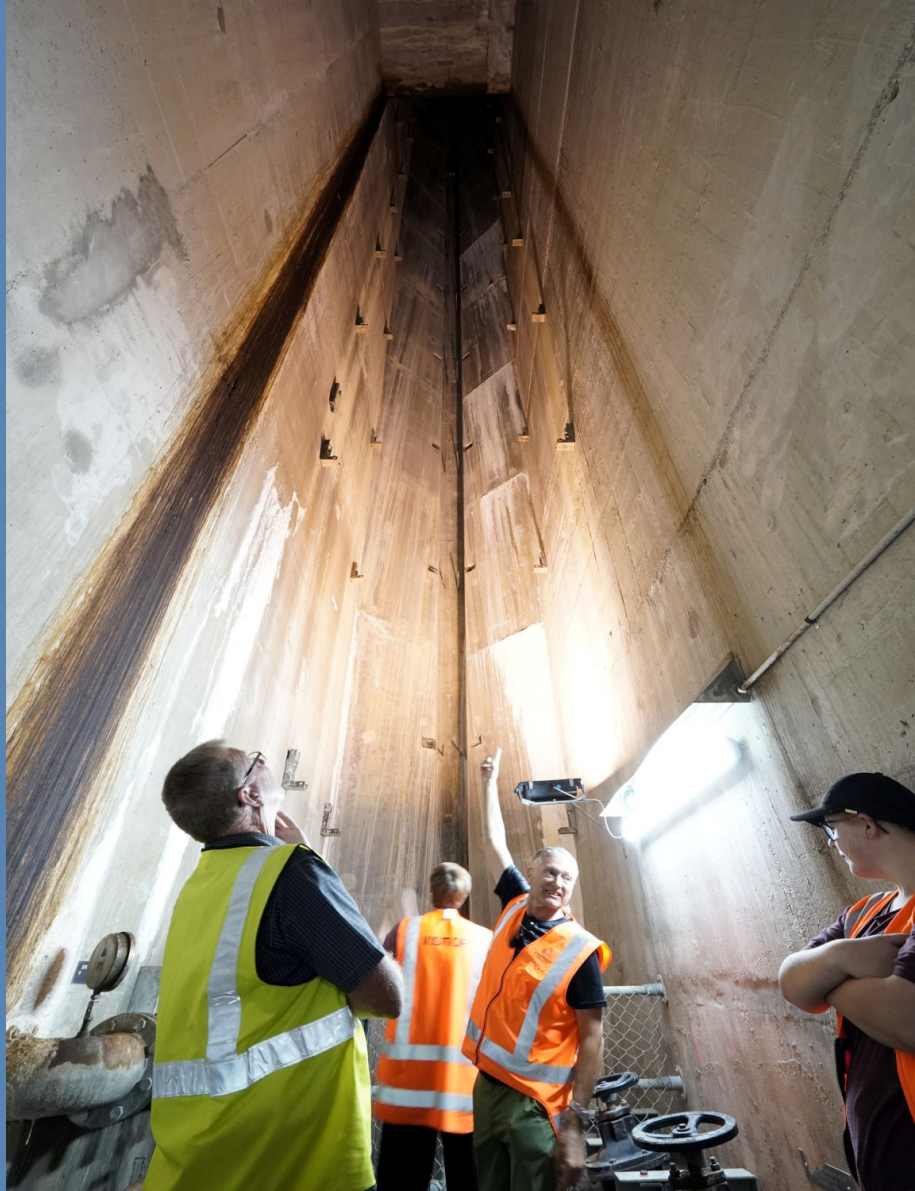

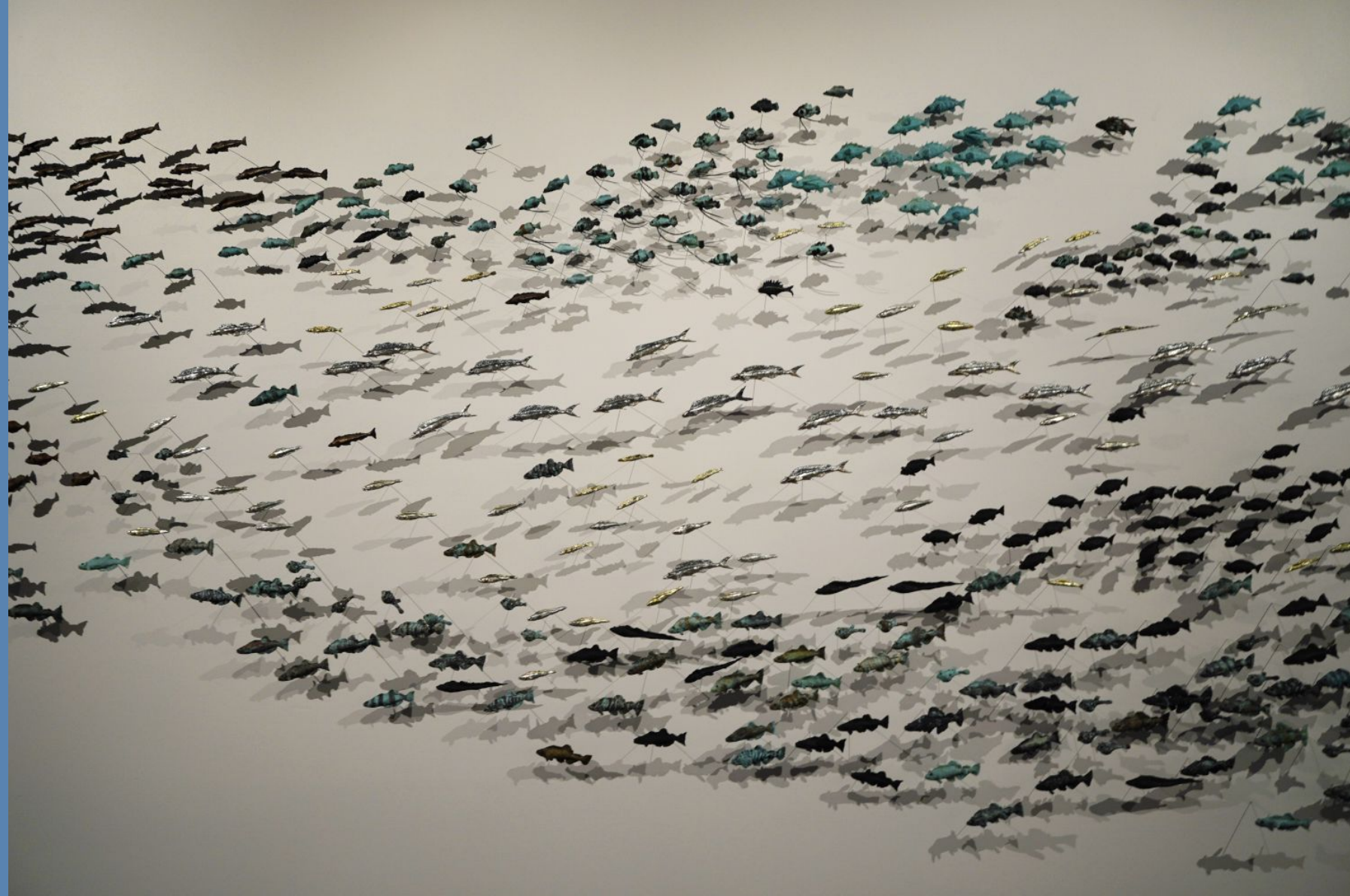
